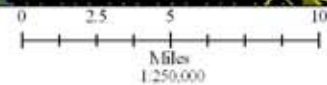


Key Terms:
Crucial Winter: Describes seasonal range or habitat which has been documented as the determining factor in a population's ability to maintain itself or to show the population objective over the long term.
Winter: Annals use the range usually in combination with other data for winter (usually between 12.1 and 4.30).
Winter Yearlong: Annals use habitat within this range on a year-round basis, but there is a significant influx of animals into the area in the winter months (12.1 to 4.30).
Spring/Summer/Fall: Annals use this range from the end of the previous winter to the onset of persistent winter conditions (usually 9.1 to 11.30).
