## **Wyoming Range field trip to proposed drilling site**

*The Hoback Basin is still under threat*

The public is invited to a field trip to hike into the site where Plains Exploration and Production Company (PXP) hopes to develop a 136-well natural gas project in the heart of the Hoback Basin, a stunning roadless area in the Bridger-Teton National Forest. The draft environmental impact statement (DEIS) for the project is expected later this summer. Because this project is located on valid leases issued prior to passage of the Wyoming Range Legacy Act, these lands have the potential to be developed.

From Daniel Junction, we will carpool along the project access road through Merna and national forest land and then proceed on foot down to the actual development site, where we'll walk around some proposed well pad locations. There will be an opportunity to learn about the Hoback Basin, the wildlife species that call it home and its other sensitive resources. We will also discuss solutions like buy-out and retirement of the leases and possible mitigation measures.
